

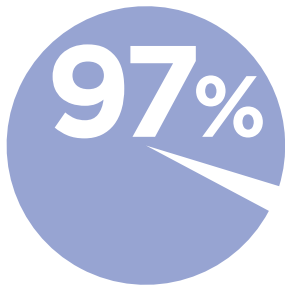
operation sight

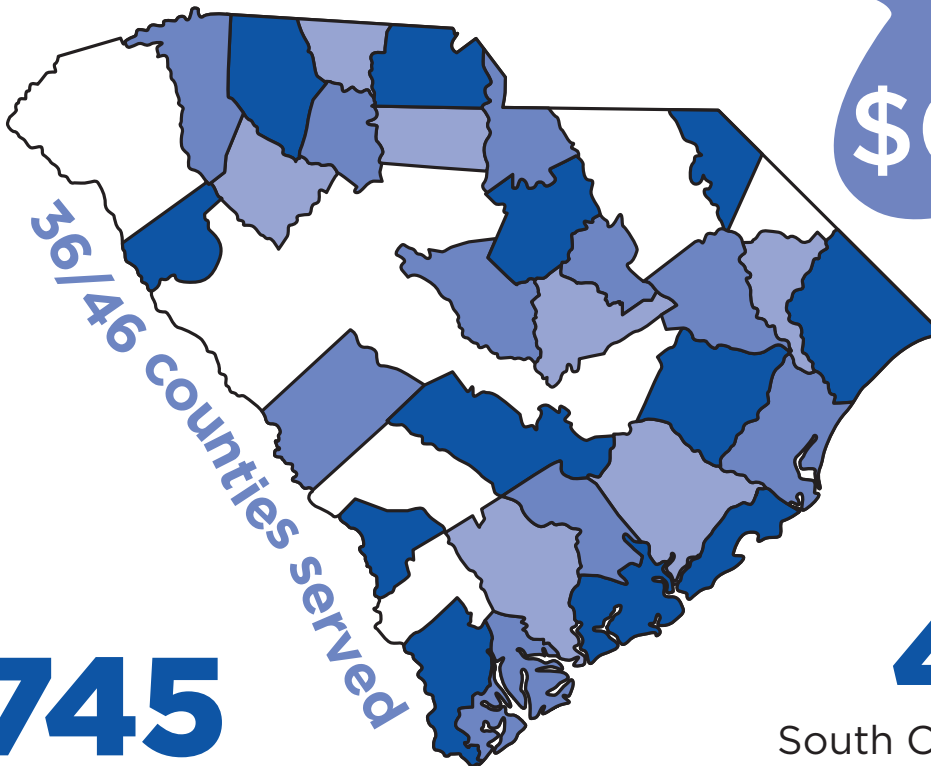
Because of the generosity and kindness of others, Operation Sight continues to spark change and make a greater impact on communities across the entire state of South Carolina.

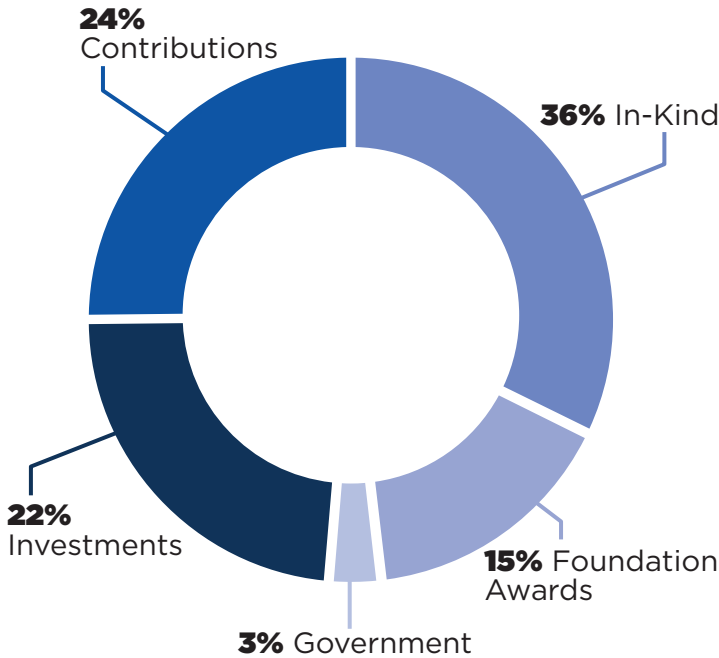

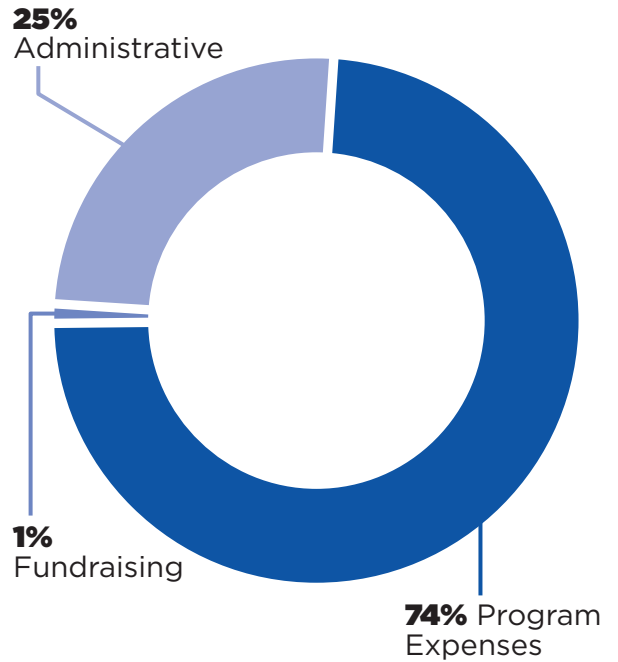
